This issue is undoubtedly one of the most common questions asked by our customers when planning a train holiday, and with good reason. When you go on a long-distance train journey, you should know what your options are to ensure that you arrive at your destination well rested and refreshed. Fortunately, Amtrak offers a variety of accommodation options and amenities to help ensure a good night's sleep, these 3 important things to know and a bit of simple preparation, you will find that sleeping peacefully on the train is not an oxymoron! 1. Amtrak sleeper accommodation (often called sleeper car) offers overnight travelers the choice of room, bedroom, bedroom suite (two adjoining bedrooms) that can accommodate one to four people and an accessible bedroom. In the room during the daytime, the seating is converted into a bed in the evenings. Sockets, climate controllers, reading lights, a small cabinet and a folding table are all within easy reach. The bedrooms are larger than the room supports and offer a sink and vanity in closed toilets and shower facilities. Amtrak's family rooms, stretching to the width of the train car, are a cozy option with a family of four. Each family room has two bunting beds, a sofa and two berths. This more spacious room gives mom and dad (or grandmother and grandfather) their own personal space, but most importantly, their own personal bed separate from the children. Amtrak's bedroom suites are from two bedrooms that have opened up connected space. Spacious and comfortable, and equipped with two landscaped windows, the bedroom suites have two toilets, two showers and are a great option for the family or group of four friends. The bedroom suites have everything the family room contains, as well as its own sink and vanity, private toilet and shower, and a comfortable armchair. Many amenities are included in the sleeping accommodation, which is considered a sleeper service in Amtrak's accommodations. Sleeper Service passengers have the right to receive all regular meals as part of your accommodation. It means full breakfast, lunch and dinner. Passengers in the sleeping car are also entitled to a selection of hotel-like amenities, including fresh linen and towel service and free bottled water. In addition, sleeper service passengers will provide you and your partner with access to Amtrak Metropolitan Lounges, located at certain stations, during your trip. Let me help you figure out the different sleeping accommodations for amtrak's long distance and overnight train rides. As a committed non-pilot, Amtrak has played an important role in my travel experiences across America. In order to travel on a cruise from non-Florida cruise port, an overnight amtrak train is required. That's how I got to know Amtrak's sleeping quarters. Amtrak's sleeping accommodation has two types: a room and a bedroom. Although both have beds, they are two different entities. There are also two types of sleeping cars with completely different train carriage equipment and sleeping areas. Let's look at two different types of long-distance trains: Amtrak Viewliner and Superliner. Amtrak sleeping quarters Amtrak Superliner deluxe bedroom with private bathroom. Viewliner Viewliner trains operate mainly on the East Coast. Due to its lower height, Viewliners can fit in many tunnels along this route. There are a few Viewliner trains on the East Coast that run west and their sleeping quarters are always sold out well in advance. The Cardinal runs between Washington, DC and Chicago, the Crescent between New Orleans and New York, and the historic Lake Shore Limited between New York and Chicago. The Viewliner room is on a sofa bed. The Viewliner is a single-level train and offers compartments that sleep two or more passengers. Roomette sleeps two passengers, the bedroom sleeps two and perhaps a very small child and in a wheelchair the accessible bedroom can accommodate two passengers. Two bedrooms can connect to a bedroom suite that sleeps four people. Roomette at a glance in the Viewliner roomette has a picture window with two wide, leaning seats that are up against each other. In the middle of the seats there is on the table that opens. There is also a top cover with its own window and basket for reading glasses etc. There is a bathroom right next to one of the seats. This consists of a folding sink with hot and cold taps, mirror, soap rack, toothbrush and washing cloth. There is a small luggage storage room in the top bunk. Amtrak Silver Star Room. That's a bathroom with a pink lid. The toilet is there too, next to one of the seats. If you're traveling alone, it's no big deal. If two people travel in a room and modesty prevails, one person may decide to step outside, while the other, well... Know. The privacy curtains have adhesive fasteners and the door has a snading lock. There are two sockets with 120v, close enough for you to charge your laptop while working on the drawer. Unlike in Europe, where there are key cards for entry, in Amtrak the department door does not lock from the outside. When you leave your department to get into a dining car, café/lounge car, Observation Lounge or step outside to stop in the stretch, your department is unlocked Read next: Night trains between New York and Miami Amtrak coffee station in a sleeping car The good news is that your car attendant seems to know who has and doesn't have a reservation for a sleeper and keeps an eye on intruders. Europeans, accustomed to their department being locked up when they leave it, tend to be a little cranky at first. But everything's working fine. Bedroom If you can afford a bedroom, go ahead. Amtrak's bedroom has plenty of space for your luggage. When you enter the bedroom, there is a folding, full-length sofa (smidgen wider than a double bed) that runs from about the doorway to the window. Above it, you have to open the bundle. Opposite the sofa is a petit sink and a worktop with space for your toiletries. Facial tissue is available (including in the room) as well as washing clothes, hand and bath towels and soap. Superliner bedroom. Almost the same as the Viewliner. Except For Section C. Smaller than A and B. Best of all, there is a private bathroom with shower. It's not big and the shower is above the toilet. When safely sealed, it works fine. It's really nice after a night's train ride to arrive at your destination completely refreshed. This has a private bathroom in the bedroom compartment, both the Viewliner and the Superliner. Toiletries are on the edge next to towels. Opposite the door of the small bathroom is a small folding chair with a storage rack and hooks above it. This allows two people to sit next to the window towards each other. The door locking system is the same as the room. Public shower room for room passengers The other end of each sleeping car on the Viewliner is the public shower room. Able to accommodate only one person at a time, your car attendant has stored it with fresh soap for each person and neatly Towels. There is a laundry basket where you can throw a used towel and washing cloth. Every sleeper car has a shower room. The nurse has even made a beautiful flower with a washing napkin. Amtrak Superliner One of Amtrak's overnight long-distance trains is the Superliner. This is Amtrak's iconic double-decker train, which operates mainly everywhere else in the United States except the East Coast because it is too high. One East Coast Superliner exception is Capitol Limited between Washington DC and Chicago. The rest of the Superliner night trains head west, with the exception of the Texas Eagle, which runs north and south between Chicago and San Antonio. This is where superliner and Viewliner differ. On board the superliner, the compartments are on two levels, and the rooms at the Superliner do not have their own sink or toilet, as in the Viewliner. Viewliner accessible bathroom in the compartment. On the lower level of the superliner there are four rooms, as well as a family bedroom at one end of the car and an accessible bedroom at the other end. On this level there are three private bathrooms, each with a sink and toilet and one separate shower room. Paper towels are available or you can bring towels from your compartment if you only use the bathroom to wash your hands. Upstairs there are both roommates and bedrooms. Four-bedroom sleepers have their own closed bathroom. Ten rooms have only one public bathroom on the upper level. Sometimes I've been in upstairs roommates when there were two public bathrooms. But that's not the norm. Choosing a Superliner Room If you want a room, how do you decide which Superliner level is best for you? If you are on a higher level, the train journey is quiet and amazingly smooth. But as I mentioned above, there is only one bathroom to share with nine or more other room passengers. If you're in a lower-level room, you'll feel the movement of the train and hear the click-through clak of the wheels. But on the lower level you have access to more bathrooms and shower rooms. For those who have difficulty walking, they may want a lower level, there is no need to climb the stairs to another level. Very convenient if you are on a train for two or three days around the country. Whatever's included in the sleeper No matter which Amtrak sleeping accommodation you choose, all your meals are included in the dining car throughout your trip. The exception is the food truck Silver Star train between Miami and New York; meals are not included. Free bottled water, coffee, tea and juice, room hostess service, individual air conditioning monitoring, soap, towels and tissues are also available when buying accommodation.
